

## FOUNDING FAMILIES OF THE RIO PUERCO RIVER VALLEY, NM GUADALUPE/OJO DEL PADRE, NM

### INTRODUCTION

The village of Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico is one of several villages that served as alternative grazing venues for sheep ranchers in the Alameda/Corrales/Bernalillo Districts.

During the 18<sup>th</sup> century Spanish Colonial Governors, particularly Provincial Governor Tomas Velez Capuchin, fostered the expansive provision of land grants in the Rio Puerco River valley for the settlement of towns and villages. The intent was these settlements would provide defensive perimeters against raids by marauding tribes of Apache and Navajo. <sup>1</sup>

Due to periodic uprisings by Native American tribes, the Rio Puerco River valley farmers and ranchers abandoned their towns and sought refuge in fortified towns closer to the Albuquerque-Bernalillo Districts.

Relative peace in the Rio Puerco River Valley did not occur until 1868 with a signing of a treaty with the Navajo, and a subsequent treaty with the Apache in 1872. <sup>2</sup>

After this period of relative peace and calm farmers, sheep ranchers, and prior land grantees began to resettle the villages of the Rio Puerco River Valley.

The arrival of the initial settlers to the site of Ojo de Padre (subsequently renamed Guadalupe) cannot be dated with certainty. <sup>3</sup>

Baptismal records for the Pueblo Mission of San Diego de Jemez date initial baptisms to a venue named “Guadalupe” beginning in 1819. Genealogy resources in Albuquerque, Bernalillo, and Santa Fe are unable to distinguish between the venues of Ojo del Padre and the village on the mesa located to the east of Jemez Pueblo from these sacramental records. <sup>4</sup>

The first documented settlers to return to the Casa Salazar area in 1867 were Francisco Aragon, Jose Ines Perea, and Jose L Santillanes.

Settlers began to return to the nearby village of Guadalupe, Bernalillo, in 1874. <sup>5</sup>

During the 18th century the Rio Puerco River Valley provided abundant grazing fodder for livestock despite the vagaries in the flow of the Rio Puerco. Seasonal rains would foster the growth of range fodder. <sup>6</sup>

Unfortunately, sheep have the tendency to chew range fodder down to the root, precluding regrowth. Range regrowth of grazing plants depends on the reseeding and adequate rainfall.

In drought years the range is unable to sustain large flocks of sheep, and ranchers continue to move their flocks to venues with greener pastures and more abundant fodder. Sheep trails lead to the northeast toward the valleys in the Jemez mountains, and west toward the towns and villages of Seboyeta, Cubero, San Rafael and San Mateo, New Mexico.

The regional drought of 1930 caused the death of half of the area's livestock.

The passage of the Taylor Grazing Act in 1934 mandated the regulation of the size of ranchers' herds. The herds were to be reduced voluntary or Federal rangers would do the culling forcibly.

The final insult that led to abandonment of the village of Guadalupe was a natural disaster.

Excessive river flow caused a rudimentary dam north of the village, built by residents to capture water flow from the Rio Puerco, to collapse and fail. The Federal Government refused to rebuild the dam.

With the inability to provide an adequate water supply to villagers' fields and crops, the town was abandoned and remains a ghost town to this day. <sup>7</sup>

### NICOLAS ANAYA/ANALLA

Nicolas Anaya was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Sandoval, New Mexico Territory (NMT) together with his wife, three children, and one grandchild. He was listed as a “laborer”.<sup>8</sup>

The 1870 US Federal Census for Sevolleta, Valencia, New Mexico Territory enumerated Nicolas Anaya with wife Gertrudis and five children.<sup>9</sup>

The sacramental record for Nuestra Senora de los Dolores, Seboyeta, Valencia, NMT, 24 January 1858, lists the baptism of Jose Pablo Anaya, son of Nicolas Anaya and Gertrudes Torres residents of Moquino, Valencia, NMT.<sup>10</sup>

Nicolas Anaya, son of Salvador Anaya and Barbara Sanchez, was born ca. 1836.<sup>11 12</sup>

Nicolas Anaya married Gertrudis Torres, daughter of Calletano Torres and Barbara Sanchez, ca. 1857.<sup>12</sup>

Salvador Anaya, son of Juan Pedro Ysidro Anaya and Dolores Lauriano Lopes, was born ca. 1802.

Salvador Anaya married Barbara Sanchez, daughter of Manuel Antonio Sanchez and Dolores Chavez, at Albuquerque, Province of New Mexico (PNM) on 25 February 1830.<sup>13 14</sup>

Juan Pedro Ysidro Anaya, son of Francisco Xavier de Anaya and Pascuala Rivera, was born in Albuquerque, PNM in June of 1767.<sup>15</sup>

Juan Pedro Anaya married Dolores Lauriana Lopes.<sup>16</sup>

Francisco Xavier de Anaya was (Indian) born ca. 1710.<sup>17 18</sup>

Francisco Xavier de Anaya married Francisca Montoya at San Juan de los Caballeros, PNM on 16 July 1731. The bride was the daughter of Antonio Montoya and Catalina Ribera.<sup>19</sup>

After the death of Francisca Montoya, Francisco Xavier de Anaya married Pascuala de Jesus Rivas at San Gabriel de las Nutrias, PNM 1767.<sup>20</sup>

Francisco Xavier de Anaya, being Native American, may have had a connection as a “*natural child*” or servant to Salvador de Anaya Almazan and his wife Magdalena de Espindola.

### FERNANDO DIONISIO APODACA

Fernando Dionisio Apodaca was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. He was listed as a “laborer” with a wife and six children.<sup>21</sup>

Fernando Dionisio Apodaca, son of Mariano Apodaca and Josefa Montoya of Los Corrales de Albuquerque, PNM, was born 3 October 1827. <sup>22</sup>

Fernando Apodaca married Placida Martin, daughter of Juan Jose Marcelino Martin and Maria Nicolasa Sanches Vergera of Corrales, NMT. at Albuquerque, NMT on 12 September 1850. <sup>23</sup>

Jose Mariano Apodaca, son of Jose Manuel Apodaca and Rosalia Gonzales, was born at Los Corrales de Albuquerque

Jose Mariano Apodaca married Josefa Montoya, daughter of Vicente Montoya and Barbara Gonzales. <sup>24</sup>

Jose Manuel Apodaca, son of Martin Antonio Apodaca and Ynes Candelaria, was born ca. 1760. <sup>25</sup>

Jose Manuel Apodaca married Rosalia Gonzales, daughter of Facundo Gonzales and Dorotea Griego, at Sandia Pueblo, PNM on 17 October 1788. <sup>26</sup>

Joe Manuel Apodaca may have been the person who married Maria Manuela Moya, resident of Tome, PNM, at Albuquerque on 28 July 1802. <sup>27</sup>

Martin Antonio Apodaca, son of Diego de Apodaca and Juliana Garcia, was born ca 1737. <sup>28</sup>

Martin Antonio Apodaca married Ines Candelaria, daughter of Antonio Candelaria and Andrea Gutierrez. <sup>29</sup>

Diego Gonzalez de Apodaca, 16 thought to have been a son of Jose Gonzalez de Apodaca and Isabel Gutierrez, was probably born at the El Paso del Norte District ca. 1686. <sup>29</sup>

Jose Gonzalez de Apodaca, son of Alferez Diego Gonzalez de Apodaca and Sebastiana Lopez de Gracia, was born ca. 1756 probably in the Salinas, District of the Province of New Mexico. <sup>30</sup>

Joe Gonzalez de Apodaca was widowed of Antonia Martin when he married Isabel Gutierrez on 12 August 1686 at El Paso del Norte, Nueva Vizcaya.<sup>3132</sup>

### GREGORIA BAROS

Maria Gregoria Baros was married to Encelso Mora. The 1880 US federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT listed Maria Gregoria as “keeping house”.

It is not certain whether Encelso Mora was away from home at the time of the Federal census and was not included in the enumeration.<sup>44</sup>

Encelso Mora of Placitas, NMT was the son of Juan Cristobal Mora and Rosalia Chaves.

Maria Gregoria Naros was the daughter of Jose Varos and Maria Juana Sandoval.<sup>3334</sup>

### NEPOMUCENO BAROS

Juan Nepomuceno Baros was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory with a wife and two children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>33</sup>

Juan Nepomuceno Baros, son of Roman/Ramon Baros and Vibiana Montoya, was born ca. 24 September 1832.<sup>35</sup>

Juan Nepomuceno Baros married Benigna Chavez at Bernalillo, NMT on 27 September 1865.<sup>36 37</sup>

Francisco Ramon Baros, son of Juan Antonio Baros and Ana Maria Nieto, was born in March 1814 on the Sandia Pueblo Indian Reservation, NMT.<sup>36 38</sup>

Ramon Barros married Bibiana Montoya, daughter of Juan Montoya and Ynes Garcia.<sup>39 39</sup>

Juan Antonio Baros, son of Matias Baros and Maria de la Luz Valerio, was born in the Sandia District, PNM ca. 1700.<sup>40</sup>

Juan Antonio Baros married Juan Maria de los Dolores Nieto, daughter of Miguel Nieto and Maria de los Dolores Salazar, at Sandia Pueblo on 13 June 1802.<sup>41</sup>

There is an entry in the marriage records for the Church at Santa Clara Pueblo, NM listing the marriage of Mathias Ramos and Maria de Valerio from Chama, PNM on 13 September 1758.

This may or may not reflect the persons of interest. It may not explain the change of surname on the part of the groom.<sup>42 4344</sup>

This said, there are connections and name identifiers that suggest that this Baros/Varos family had distinct “*coyote*” and “*genizaro*” connections at Abiquiu, Santa Clara, and Sandia, PNM.

### SILVERIO BENAVIDEZ

Silverio Benavidez was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife and three children.<sup>46</sup> His occupation was listed as “laborer”.

Silverio Benavides may have been the person born at San Ildefonso Pueblo, Santa Fe, PNM in June 1833.

The parents were listed as Juan Benavides and Benita Trujillo.<sup>454647</sup>

A Silvero Benavidez was enumerated with a wife and two children in the 1860 US Federal Census for Bernalillo, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory.<sup>49</sup>

Antonio Cordova was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census, Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife and four dependents. His occupation was listed as “blacksmith”.<sup>50</sup>

Antonio Cordova, son of Diego Cordova and Maria Juliana Santillanes, was born in the Bernalillo District, PNM in 1832.<sup>48</sup>

Antonio Cordova married Maria Dolores Griego, daughter of Juan Griego and Maria Luna Candelaria, at Bernalillo, NMT on 25 April 1858.<sup>49</sup>

Diego Antonio Cordova, son of Salvador Manuel Cordova and Ana Maria Francisca Gonzalez, was born in Corrales, PNM ca. 1791.<sup>50 54</sup>

Diego Antonio Cordova married Maria Juliana Micaela de Los Dolores Santillanes, at Albuquerque on 28 November 1810. The bride was the daughter of Juan Joseph Santillanes and Maria Juliana Gonzales.<sup>55 51</sup>

Salvador Manuel Cordova, son of Antonio Cordova and Barbara Benabides, was born in December 1760 at Tesuque, PNM.<sup>52 53</sup>

Salvador Manuel Cordova married Maria Francisca Gonzalez of Corrales on 5 February 1782.<sup>58</sup>

Antonio Cordova, son of Lazaro Cordova and Petronila de Avila, was born in the San Juan District, PNM in June 1733.<sup>54</sup>

Lazaro Cordova, son of Antonio de Cordova and Eugenia de Herrea, was probably born at Guadalupe del Paso, Nueva Vizcaya, Nueva Espana ca 1690.

Lazaro Cordova married Ana Valdes, daughter of Ayudanta Luis Valdes and Maria de Cabrera of Mexico City, at Santa Cruz de la Canada, PNM on 10 June 1710.<sup>60 61</sup>

**JOSE REYES DURAN**

Jose Reyes Duran was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. He was listed as “divorced”.<sup>62</sup>

He was previously married to Maria Rafael Archibeque, daughter of Simon Archibeque and Juliana Garcia of Algodones Santa Ana, NMT.

Jose de los Reyes was probably born in Bernalillo, PNM in January 1838 to Juana Duran, daughter of Mateo Duran and Maria Antonia Munes (Muniz).

Jose Matheo de Los Dolores Duran, son of Miguel Antonio Duran and Ygnacia Griego, was born 21 September 1787 at Los Duranes, PNM.<sup>55</sup>

Jose Mateo Duran married Maria Antonia Munes.

Miguel Antonio Duran, son of Antonio Duran de Armijo and Maria Matilda Garcia de Noriega, was born ca. 1762.

Miguel Antonio Duran married Maria Ygnasia Griego at Albuquerque, PNM on 15 September 1786.<sup>56</sup>

Antonio Duran, son of Jose Yban Cedillo Duran and Maria Casilda Garcia Jurado, was born at Albuquerque if we are to conder the baptism of his sibling Miguel

Antonio Duran married Matilda Garcia de Noriega, daughter of Juan Garcia de Noriega and Maria Jaramillo, at Albuquerque on 5 May 1758.

Jose Garcia y Rael was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. He was listed as single and employed as a “laborer”.

He was probably born in the Bernalillo, NMT District ca 1838, a son of Juan Bautista Garcia de Noriega and Maria Francisca Rael.

**JOSE DE JESUS GARCIA DE NORIEGA**

Jose de Jesus de Noriega was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census together with his wife and a granddaughter

Jose de Jesus Garcia de Noriega was most probably born in the Bernalillo District, PNM ca 1825.

Ambrosio Gonzales married Viviana Chabes ca. 1847.<sup>58</sup>

Salbador Manuel Gonzales, son of Manuel Gonzales and Maria Toribia Armijo, was born ca. 1793.

Salbador Manuel Gonzales married Maria Manuela Aragon of Tome, PNM, daughter of Francisco Aragon and Margarita Baca, at Tome in August 1813.<sup>59</sup>

Manuel Gonzales, son of Julian Gaspar Gonzales Bas and Maria Josepha Martin(es), was born ca. 1754.<sup>60</sup>

Manuel Gonzales married Maria Toribia Armijo at Sandia on 27 September 1779.<sup>61</sup>

Julian Gaspar Gonzales Bass, son of Antonio Gonzales Bas and Josepha Varela Jaramillo, was born in January 1730 at Albuquerque, PNM.<sup>62</sup>

Julian Gaspar Gonzales Bas married Maria Josepha Martin(es) at Albuquerque on 25 May 1752.<sup>63</sup>

Antonio Gonzales Bas, son of Juan Gonzales Bas and Maria Lopez dl Castillo, was born ca. 1668.

Juan Gonzales Bas, son Juan Gonzales Bas and Nicolasa Zaldivar Jorge, was born ca. 1643 in the Province of New Mexico.<sup>66</sup>

### LUIS GONZALES

Luis Gonzales was enumerated with his wife in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. His occupation was listed as laborer.<sup>67 68</sup>

Luis Gonzales, probably son of Juan Ygnacio Tafoya and Anna Maria Gonzales, was born in the Puesto de Alameda, PNM ca. 1839.<sup>69</sup>

There is no explanation as of this writing for the surname change.

Luis Gonzales Tafoya married Anna Maria Gonzales, daughter of Miguel Gonzales and Rosa Montoya of Corrales, PNM, at Albuquerque, PNM on 17 April 1847.<sup>70</sup>

Juan Ygnacio Tafoya, son of Juan Tafoya and Rosa Gongora, was born ca. 1776.

Juan Ygnacio Tafoya married Antonia Josefa Candelaria (Baca) in April 1797.<sup>71</sup>

After the death of Josefa Candelaria, Juan Ygnacio Tafoya married Ana Maria Gonzales, widow of Jose Domingo Gurule, at Albuquerque PNM on 24 February 1823.<sup>72</sup>

Juan Tafoya, son of Cristoval Tafoya and Isabel de Herrera, was born at Santa Cruz de la Canada, PNM ca 1694.

Juan Tafoya, *viudo de Antonia Gonzales*, married Rosa Gongora (*viuda de Juan Egidio*) at Albuquerque, PNM on 14 September 171.<sup>73</sup>

Cristobal de Tafoya Altamirano, son of Juan de Tafoya and Felipa Juaguada de Ulloa, was born at the Real de Tamponage, Province of Nueva Espana ca. 1661.<sup>74</sup>

### ANTONIO M. (JOSE VICENTE) GRIEGO

The 1880 US federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT enumerated head of household Antonio M. Griego together with a wife and two children. The occupation for Antonio M. Griego is listed as “laborer”.<sup>75</sup>

The available historical information lists the family members to a “Jose Vicente Griego”. In light of this one has to question whether or not the census taker enumerated incorrect information, or the documented individual provided and incomplete or erroneous name.

Jose Vicente Griego, son of Manuel Griego and Maria Francisca Gutierrez, was born ca. 1845.

Jose Vicente Griego married Maria de Los Angeles Sais, daughter of Francisco Sais and Maria Francisca Antonia Chavez, at Bernalillo in 1862.<sup>76</sup>

Manuel Griego, son of Jose Griego and Maria Rosa Urban(o) Montoya, was born ca 1796. He was baptized at Santa Ana Pueblo, PNM on 4 June 1796.<sup>77</sup>

Jose Manuel Griego married Maria Francisca Gutierrez.ca. 1825. The bride was the daughter of Francisco Gutierrez and Graciana Chavez.<sup>78</sup>

Jose Antonio, son of Baltazar Griego and Manuela Gurule, was born in January 1748 in the Albuquerque District, PNM.<sup>79</sup>

Jose Antonio may have been the person who married Rosalia Gallegos (Urbano Montano?) at Albuquerque, PNM on 2 November 1777.<sup>80</sup>

The bride (Maria Rossa) was the daughter of Antonio Urbano (Montano) and Juana Ortega.<sup>81</sup>

Baltazar Griego, son of Alferes Blas Griego and Ines Romero, was born ca. 1686.<sup>84</sup>

### ALBINO GURULE

Albino Gurule was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife and two children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>85</sup>

Albino Gurule, son of Jose de Jesus Gurule and Guadalupe Mora, was born ca. 1852 probably in Algodones, Santa Ana, NMT.<sup>86</sup>

Albino Gurule married Maria Concepcion Padilla at Nuestra Concepcion de los Dolores Church in Bernalillo, NMT on 15 November 1875.<sup>87</sup>

Jose de Jesus Gurule, son of Salvador Gurule and Maria Gertrudis Montano, was born in March 1818 possibly at Algodones, Santa Ana, NMT.<sup>88 89</sup>

Jose de Jesus Gurule married Maria Guadalupe do los Santos Mora, daughter of Antonio Jose Mora and Margarita Lucero of Tome, PNM.<sup>90</sup>

Salvador Manuel Gurule, son of Antonio Gurule and Maria Dionicia Santa Gertrudis Lucero, was born ca. 1782.<sup>91</sup>

Antonio Gurule married Dionesia/Leonisia Gertrudis Lucero, daughter of Sebastian Lucero and Maria Archuleta of Canada de Cochiti, PNM, in August 1771.<sup>95 96</sup>

Capitan Juan Antonio Grolet/Gurule, son of Santiago Grolet and Elena Gallegos, was born on 2 April 1703 in Bernalillo, PNM.<sup>97</sup>

### JOSE BENITO LUCERO

Jose Benito Lucero was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NM together with his wife and three children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>98</sup>

Jose Benito Lucero, son of Felipe Lucero and Maria Dolores Gabriella Gallardo, was born ca.1834 in the Corrales, New Mexico area.<sup>99 100</sup>

Jose Benito Lucero married Maria de Jesus Hurtado, daughter of Salvador Hurtado and Andrea Gallegos.<sup>101</sup>

Felipe Lucero married Maria de Jesus Chaves, daughter of Jose Angel Chaves and Maria Barbara Aragon, at Sandia Pueblo on 14 November 1814.<sup>102</sup>

After the death of Maria de Jesus Chaves, Felipe Lucero married Maria Dolores Gabriella Gallardo, daughter of Jose Eusebio Ubaldo Gallardo and Maria Lugarda Martin.<sup>103 104</sup>

Felipe Lucero, son of Diego Antonio Lucero and Juliana Gurule, was born in April 1788.<sup>105</sup> Diego Antonio Lucero born ca.1760 is thought to have been the son of Jose Miguel Lucero and Maria Josefa Salazar.

Diego Antonio Lucero married Francisca Montoya.<sup>116</sup>

After the death of Francisca Montoya Diego Antonio Lucero married Maria Juliana Gurule, daughter of Zerafino Gurule and Maria Gertrudis Aragon, at Albuquerque, PNM on 16 August 1785.<sup>106</sup>

Jose Miguel Lucero, son of Diego II Lucero de Godoy and Ana Maria Martin, was born at Ojo Caliente, Rio Arriba, PNM on 14 December 1729.<sup>107</sup>

Jose Miguel Lucero married Maria Josefa Salazar, daughter of Miguel Salazar and Francisca Luna of Puesto de Chama, PNM, at Santa Clara Pueblo on 25 March 1756.<sup>108</sup>

After the death of Maria Josefa Salazar, Joe Miguel Lucero married Maria Manuela Aragon, daughter of Andres Aragon and Elena Duran y Chaves.<sup>109</sup>

Diego II Lucero de Godoy, son of Diego I Lucero de Godoy and Margarita Baca, married Ana Maria Martin at San Juan de ls Caballeros on 3 February 1726.<sup>121</sup>

Diego I Lucero de Godoy, son of Alferez Antonio Lucero de Godoy and Juana Varela de Perea (Losada), was born ca. 1651.<sup>110</sup>

Antonio Lucero de Godoy, son of Juan Lucero de Godoy and one of three wives, was born in the Province of New Mexico.

### PAULA LUCERO

Paula Lucero was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo together with one child. She is listed as either “divorced or widowed.”<sup>111</sup>

Paula Lucero, daughter of Miguel Lucero and Andrea Pacheco of Alameda, NMT, married Miguel Antonio de Herrera at Albuquerque on 10 May 1846. The groom was the son of Jose Herrera and Barbara Santillanes of Alameda, NMT.<sup>112</sup>

### JOSE MONTANO

Jose Montano was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory together with his wife and son.<sup>113</sup>

### JOSE SEVERO MONTANO

Jose Severo Montano was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory together with his wife.<sup>125 114</sup>

Jose Severiano Montano may have been the child born in January 1855. And baptized on 21 February 1855 at Seboyeta, Valencia, NMT. The parents were listed as Antonico (NS) and Dolores (NS).<sup>115</sup>

There may have been a discrepancy between the alleged baptismal parents and those listed in the marriage to Maria Luz Candelaria.

The officiant in the above listed baptism was Fr. Rafael Chaves, who was subsequently defrocked by the bishop in Santa Fe during his tenure as parish priest.

It has been alleged that in retribution on the actions of his bishop, Fr. Chavez purposefully either wrote incorrect or incomplete Sacramental Records during his Ecclesiastical Tenure.

Jose Y. Montano married Angela Lerma, daughter of Antonio Lerma and Anamaria Rodriguez, at Albuquerque on 6 January 1872. <sup>119</sup>

Lorenzo Montano, son of Antonio Montano and Manuela Antonia Martin, was born in August 1817. <sup>120</sup>

Lorenzo Montano married Petra Candelaria.

Antonio Montano, son of Jose Antonio de la Encarnacion Montano and Maria Ygnacia Santillanes, was born ca. 1796. <sup>121</sup>

Antonio Montano married Manuel Antonia Martin, daughter of Baltasar Martin(es) and Maria Antonia Griego. <sup>122 123</sup>

Evaristo Montoya was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory. He was listed as “married” but no family members were listed. Occupation stated was that of “laborer”.<sup>132</sup>

Evaristo Montoya, born ca. 1845, may have been the son of Jose Pablo Montoya and Manuela Montoya of Galisteo District, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Evaristo Montoya married Bernabella Padilla of Galisteo, Santa Fe, NMT daughter of Teodoro Padilla and Maria Ruival, at Santa Fe, NMT on 11 October 1969.<sup>124</sup>

Available demographic data appears to suggest that Evaristo Montoya migrated between Galisteo, NMT, Puerto de Luna, San Miguel, NMT, and Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT.<sup>125 126127</sup>

### JUAN MORA Y MARQUEZ

Juan Mora y Marquez was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory with his child/grandchild.<sup>136</sup>

Juan Lucas Mora y Marquez was probably the son of Ysidro Mora and Juana Marques. He was listed as a “laborer”, and his marital status was noted as “widower”.

Juan Lucas Mora, born 224 October 1824 in the Albuquerque District, was probably the son of Ysidro Mora and Juana Marques.<sup>128</sup>

Juan Mora married Maria Teodora Gurule, daughter of Tomas Gurule and Maria Pasquala Griego.

Ysidro Antonio Mora, son of Pablo Mora and Maria Manuela (Gurule) of Valencia, PNM, was born on 16 May 1777.<sup>129</sup>

Jose Maria Mora was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory together with his wife and seven children.<sup>138</sup> He was listed as a “laborer”.

Jose Maria de los Santos Mora, son of Juan Cristobal Mora and Maria Rosalia Chavez, was born at Placitas, Santa Ana, Province of New Mexico ca. 1839.<sup>132</sup>

Jose Maria Mora married Maria Hernandez, daughter of Jose Maria Hernandez and Vitoria Garcia, at Nuestra Senora de los Dolores on 10 August 1859.<sup>133 134</sup>

Juan Cristobal Mora, son of Salvador Antonio Mora and Rosa Zalazar, was born in January 1795.<sup>135</sup>

Juan Cristobal Mora married Maria Rosalia Chaves, daughter of Jose Rafael Chaves and Maria Isidora Gutierrez, at Sandia Pueblo, PNM on 10 February 1819.<sup>136</sup>

Salbador Antonio Mora is thought to have been born ca. 1768 in the Sandia District, PNM.

Salbador Antonio Mora married Maria Rosa Salazar at Albuquerque, PNM on 25 July 1790.<sup>137</sup>

### JUANA MORA

Juana Mora was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. She was listed as “keeping house”. She was listed as “widowed”.<sup>138</sup>

Maria Juana Mora, may have been the daughter of Juan Cristobal Mora and Rosalia Chaves, born between 1816-1820 in the Sandia District, PNM.

She is listed in the household of Juan Nepomuceno Mora and Maria Anastacia Lobato, and identified as “sister”.<sup>139</sup>

Maria Juan Mora is not found in the household of Jose Usebio Lobato of Algodones, Santa Ana, NMT as is the case for Maria Anastacia, so one might assume that she is the sister of Juan Nepomuceno Mora.<sup>140</sup>

She was widowed of Jose Eulogio Lujan, son of Alexandro Lujan and Nicolasa Perea.<sup>141</sup>

### ESQUIPULA NIETO

Esquipula Nieto was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NM together with his wife and three children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>146</sup>

Esquipula Nieto, son of Maria Felipa Nieto, was born in the Sandia District, PNM in March 1819.

Jose Esquipulas Nieto married Marcelina (Garcia?) Nieto. The bride may have been the daughter of Miguel Garcia and Reyes Jaramillo of the Sandia District. PNM.<sup>142</sup>

Maria Felipa de Jesus Nieto born 6 February 1801, may have been the daughter of Juan Rafael Nieto and Maria Baldez.<sup>143 144</sup>

Juan Rafael Nieto, son of Antonio Nieto and Maria Antonia Pacheco (Salazar), is thought to have been born in May 1766 in the Santa Fe District, PNM.<sup>145</sup>

Juan Rafael Nieto married Maria Gertrudis Salazar, daughter of Mateo Salazar and Ana Maria Garcia, at Sandia Pueblo on 12 November 1788.<sup>146</sup>

### ANTONIA ROMERO

Antonia Romero was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. she was listed as a “widow” with four children.

Maria Antonia Mora Romero was born ca. 1853.<sup>147</sup>

Maria Antonia (Mora) Romero was listed as the wife of Jesus Maria Romero in the baptismal record for Jose Bonifacio Romero in Bernalillo, NMT on 4 June 1871.<sup>148 149</sup>

### CATALINO ROMERO

Catalino Romero was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, New Mexico Territory with his wife and one adopted/dependent child.<sup>155 150</sup>

Catalino Romero, son of Ramon Romero and Ygnacio Romero, was born in the Santa Fe District, PNM on 25 November 1847.<sup>151</sup>

Catalino Romero married Maria Josefa Silva, daughter of Francisco Silva and Maria Rita Lucero of Linitar, Belen, New Mexico Territory, at Bernalillo on 13 November 1871.<sup>152 153</sup>

Jose Ramon Romero, son of Felipe Romero and Gertrudis Baca, was born in February 1814 in the Santa Fe District, PNM.<sup>154</sup>

Juan de Jesus Salaz married Maria Dolores Gonzales on 11 January 1854 at San Miguel del Vado, San Miguel, NMT.<sup>201 202</sup>

### **Jesus Salazar**

Jesus Salazar was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife, seven children, and one dependent child.<sup>205</sup> His occupation was listed as laborer.

Juan Felipe de Jesus Salazar, probably the child of Miguel Salazar and Gertrudis Tapia of the Sandia District, was born 5 June 1844.<sup>203</sup>

Jesus Salazar married Maria Cicilia Mora.<sup>204</sup>

Jose Miguel Salazar, son of Miguel Antonio Salazar and Maria Frebonia Gurule of the Sandia District, was born on 17 March 1794.<sup>205</sup>

Miguel Salazar married Maria Dolores Chavez, widow of Agustin de la Pena at Isleta Pueblo, PNM, on 25 August 1824.<sup>206</sup>

Miguel Salazar subsequently married Gertrudis Tapia.<sup>207</sup>

Miguel Antonio Salazar, son of Miguel Mateo Salazar and Anna Maria Garcia de Noriega, was born ca. 1762.

Miguel Antonio Salazar married Maria Frebonia Gurule, daughter of Martin Gurule and Maria Angela Aragon, at Sandia Pueblo on 28 November 1784.<sup>208</sup>

Miguel Mateo Salazar, son of Francisco Miguel Salazar and Francisca de San Juan Luna Muniz, was born in the Chama District, PNM ca. 1738.

Miguel Mateo Salazar married Ana Maria Garcia de Noriega, daughter of Luis Garcia de Noriega and his second wife Barbara Garcia y Jurado.<sup>209 210 211</sup>

### JOSE MARIA SANCHES

Jesus Maria Sanches was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife and two children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>213</sup>

Jesus Maria Sanches, son of Juan Jose Sanchez and Maria Juana Mora of Bernalillo, was born on 1 October 1850.<sup>212</sup>

Jose Maria Sanches married Barbara Sanches.

Juan Jose Sanches, son of Santiago Sanchez and Manuela Gurule, was born ca. 1791.<sup>213</sup>

Juan Sanches married Manuela Lucero ca. 1830.<sup>214</sup>

Widowed from Manuela Lucero, Juan Sanches married Maria Juana Mora at San Felipe Pueblo in August 1842.<sup>215 216 217</sup>

Santiago Sanchez, possible son of Rosa Sanchez (Apache) was born ca. 1757.<sup>218</sup>

Santiago Sanchez married Maria Manuela Gurule, daughter of Antonio Gurule and Dionicia Lucero, at San Felipe Pueblo on 11 September 1797.<sup>219</sup>

### MICAELA SANCHES

Micaela Sanches was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT. She was listed as a “widow”. Micaela Sanches was born ca. 1833/1835.<sup>217 218</sup>

The 1900 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, MNT lists Toribio Salas as “head of household”, with Antonia Salas as his wife. The same domicile lists Micaela Sanches as “mother”.<sup>220</sup>

One assumes that Micaela Sanches is mother to Antonia Salas.<sup>221</sup>

The death certificate for Toribio Salas lists his wife as “Antonia Romero”.<sup>222</sup>

Since a different set of birth surnames parents are listed for Antonia Salas, one can assume that Micaela Sanches was mother to Antonia Salas.

This creates a conundrum as to whether the maiden name of Micaela Sanches was Sanches, Mora, Romero, or something else.

### ANASTACIO SANDOVAL

Anastacio Sandoval was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife and two children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>223</sup>

Anastacio Sandoval, son of Juan Sandoval and Josefa Padilla of the Santa Fe District, was born ca. May 1846.<sup>224 225 226</sup>

Anastacio Sandoval married Maria Vigil Quintana, daughter of Alfonsa Cena y Chaves, on 12 March 1875.<sup>227</sup>

Juan Sandoval, son of Pedro Sandoval and Isidora Gallegos, was born ca. 1814 in the Santa Fe District, NMT.

Juan Sandoval married Trinidad Archibeque, daughter of Francisco Archibeque and Rosa Lobato of the Santa Fe District, on 3 January 1842.<sup>228</sup>

Juan Sandoval widowed of Trinidad Archibeque, married Josefa Gonzales, daughter of Jose Maria Padyia and Maria Dolores Martines of the Santa Fe District, PNM. on 22 November 1843.<sup>229</sup>

Pedro Antonio Sandoval, son of Joseph Miguel Sandoval and Maria Ygnacia Armenta of the Santa Fe District, was born ca. 1786.<sup>230</sup>

Pedro Antonio Sandoval, soldier, married Dolores Gallego in Santa Fe, PNM on 23 October 1809.<sup>231</sup>

Joseph Miguel Sandoval, son of Andres Sandoval and Maria Marques of the Santa Fe District, PNM was born on 17 May 1753.<sup>232</sup>

Joseph Miguel Sandoval married Maria Ygnacia Armenta on 5 April 1783.<sup>233</sup>

Andres Sandoval, son of Miguel de Dios Sandoval y Martines and Lucia Gomez y Robledo of the Santa Fe District, was born ca. 1704 in the Santa Fe District, PNM.<sup>234</sup>

Andres Sandoval married Maria Marques at Santa Fe Pueblo.<sup>235 236</sup>

### ANA MARIA SANDOVAL

Ana Maria Sandoval was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with four adult and minor children. Ana Maria Gonzales Sandoval was listed as a widow, previously married to Desiderio Sandoval.<sup>237</sup>

There appears to be three other marriages of Desiderio Sandoval occurring after January 1889.<sup>238</sup>

A supposition can be made that Ana Maria Gonzales was not a widow but perhaps a case of either abandonment or divorce.

Desiderio Sandoval, son of Jose Celedon Sandoval and Maria Manuela Aguero of Chama, Rio Arriba, NMT, was born ca. 1869.<sup>242</sup>

Ana Maria Gonzales, daughter of Jose Maria Gonzales and Maria Gertrudis Garcia of the Albuquerque, District, PNM, was born 15 March 1828.<sup>243</sup>

### JUAN SISNEROS

Juan Sisneros was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NM together with his wife and two children.<sup>244</sup>

The birth year for Juan Sisneros appears to be variable from US Federal Census decade, and appears to range from 1805-1812. Unfortunately, this brings into question reliable information as to descendency. There existed a rather extensive Sisneros extended family living in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century Bernalillo, New Mexico District according to extant sacramental records.<sup>245</sup>

A daughter of Juan Sisneros and Victoria Gallego, Maria de los Angeles Cisneros, married Jesus Salas mentioned previously.<sup>246</sup>

### ALBINO VALDEZ

Albino Valdez was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census together with his wife and three children. His occupation was listed as “laborer”.<sup>247</sup>

Albino Valdez, son of Miguel Valdez and Maria Marcelina Muniz (Munoz), was born ca. 1846 in the Bernalillo District, NMT.<sup>248 249</sup>

Albino Valdez married Maria Cesaria Lujan, daughter of Lonicio (Dionicio) Lujan and Josefa Gallego of Bernalillo, on 21 January 1854 in Bernalillo, NMT.<sup>250</sup>

### JUAN VALDEZ

Juan Valdez was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with his wife and three children. The occupation for Juan Valdez was listed as “laborer”.<sup>251</sup>

Juan Valdez, probable son of Miguel Valdez and Maria Marcelina Munoz of Bernalillo, was born ca. 1848.

Juan Valdez married Maria Cornelia Archibeque, daughter of Juan Nepomuceno Archibeque and Maria Juana Gurule of Los Lomitas, on 8 February 1869.<sup>252 253 254 255</sup>

Miguel Valdez, son of Jose Valdez and Maria Gertrudis Duran y Chaves, was born ca. 1802 in the Bernalillo District, PNM.<sup>251</sup>

Miguel Valdes (Baldes) married Maria Cimona Romero, daughter of Pedro Romero and Maria Niebes Gallego, at Sandia on 3 April 1837.<sup>256</sup>

Miguel Valdes, widowed of Maria Simona Romero, married Maria Marcelina Munis at Sandia on 15 June 1841. The bride was the daughter of Lucrecio Munis and Guadalupe Sanches.<sup>257</sup>

Jose Antonio Valdes, son of Alonzo Valdes and Juana Nieto, was born on January 1770 in the Santa Fe District, PNM.<sup>258</sup>

Jose Valdes married Gertrudis Chavez, daughter of Jose Chavez and Elena Gurule, at Sandia on 2 June 1794.<sup>259</sup>

### RITA VALDEZ

Rita Valdez was enumerated in the 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT together with one child. Rita Valdez was listed as "single".<sup>260</sup>

Rita Valdez, possibly the daughter of Juan de Feria Valdez and Maria Juana Trujillo of Ranchos de Taos, Rio Arriba, PNM, was born ca. 1845.<sup>261 262</sup>

The 1880 US Federal Census for Guadalupe, Bernalillo, NMT lists only one child living with Rita Valdez, so one can make an assumption that there couple were no longer cohabitating.

There was either a divorce or the couple were never married.
